



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT FIREARM PURCHASES

You must be **18** or older to purchase a long gun and **21** or older to purchase a handgun, stripped receiver, or pistol-grip shotgun

Only **one** new handgun purchase is allowed in a 30-day period

You must have a current Firearm Safety Certificate (FSC) when you purchase any firearm, unless you have an active Concealed Carry Weapon Permit (CCW), active or retired Military card, or if you are active or retired Law Enforcement

Handgun purchases require current proof of residency for the DOJ, which must have your current physical address and your name printed on it. Accepted forms are:

1. Current Vehicle Registration
2. Property Deed or Title
3. Rental or Lease Agreement*
4. Phone Landline**
5. Cable or Satellite**
6. Gas or Electric Bill**
7. Water**
8. Garbage**
9. Propane Delivery**

Purchaser's are exempt from proof of residence for the DOJ if they are the following:

1. Active CCW permit
2. Active Law Enforcement
3. Military Permanent Duty Station Orders for CA

The ATF requires proof of residency if your Driver's License or ID card does not match your current address. Accepted forms are:

1. Current Hunting License
2. Current Vehicle Registration
3. Government Utilities
4. Any Valid, Government Issued Document

There is a minimum 10-day (240 hours) wait for firearm pick-up. Your Dealer Record of Sale (DROS) expires after 30 days from the date it was run. After 30 days a new DROS will have to be run, the fees collected again, and another 10-day wait will be required.

Firearm sales that are "delayed" by the DOJ will not be released unless an "approval after delay" is issued.

Once you have run a DROS on a firearm, you may be subject to a 20% restocking fee on the retail amount of the firearm if you cancel. If you receive a DROS denial by either DOJ or DMV due to ineligibility, you will be subject to a 20% restocking fee on the retail amount of the firearm.

All firearm fees, such as the DROS and Dealer Fees, are nonrefundable.

All firearm purchases are final.

The purchaser is required to have proof of a California approved locking device for **each** firearm owned. All firearms must be locked when they leave the premises. The following must be provided if the firearm does not come with an OEM lock and the purchaser will not be purchasing one from us:

1. A Completed and Signed Gun Safe Affidavit (for long guns only)
2. An Approved Lock (new in package) with Proof of Purchase

* Must have the signature of the landlord and renter and include the current time period

** Must be issued within the past 3 months
